## Operation Christmas Child

Imagine a little boy opening a gift of things he can't even imagine. Add into that the joy of learning that there is someone that loves him, so much that He would give His life for him. The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children around the world, and together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Operation Christmas Child boxes give us an opportunity to reach out to children in a way that would not be possible otherwise. The boxes begin as a way of getting the child's attention and then while he is listening they are provided a book that explains who Jesus is and to share the Gospel with them.

This small shoe box full of little gifts along with the booklet full of the teachings of Jesus Christ gives children something deeper than physical help. It is a blessing to see the powerful change in their hearts.

Grace Church's goal is to put together 55 boxes this year. The deadline is **November 6** to get them to the church. If you are unable to shop and put together a box, financial donations are gratefully accepted as well.

Please pray for this important demonstration of how God's love can change the world, one child at a time.

### How to pack a box —

1 – Use an empty shoe box (standard size, please) or a small plastic container. We have a limited amount of Operation Christmas Child boxes that you can use. If you use your own box, you can wrap the box (but do the lid separately). Wrapping is not required. Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift.

2 - Determine whether your gift will be for a boy or a girl and the child's age category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. Mark the correct age category on the label and tape the label to the top of the box. The labels are found in the brochure available from the church or on line at [http://www.samaritanspurse.org/index.php/OCC/Pack\\_A\\_Shoe\\_Box/](http://www.samaritanspurse.org/index.php/OCC/Pack_A_Shoe_Box/)

3 – Fill the box with a variety of gifts that will bring delight to a child.

4 – Please donate \$7 or more for each shoe box you prepare to help cover shipping and other project costs. You can give online by using the EZGIVE option, or you can write a check to Samaritan's Purse (note 'OCC' on the memo line) and place it in an envelope on top of the gift items inside the box. If you or your family are preparing more than one shoe box, please make one combined donation.

### **HONOR OUR VETERANS**

## **GRACE FOUNDATION UPDATES**

The Grace Church Foundation was created in early 2006. It was started with \$10,000 "seed money" via a transfer from the Endowment Fund. It is professionally managed and accounted for via segregated funds at the Muskingum County Community Foundation.

The Foundation is a vehicle for memorial contributions, bequests, or various other gifts. The goal is to grow the Foundation to a significant principal amount wherein the earnings annually could be used to cover a large part of the church's fixed operating expenses (i.e. apportionments or salaries) thereby allowing more of the current giving to be used for programs.

Most years when the dispersible amount was relatively small, the decision was made to retain it to grow the account balance. In 2013, \$3,000 was distributed to go towards the purchase of the new outdoor sign and an additional \$1,500 was awarded to Jessica Sands Stonecypher as a "foundation" to her theological studies. In June of this year, \$8,000 was distributed from the Foundation towards the new sound system.

Earlier this year, Grace was blessed with a significant bequest from the Crawford estate. Since Bill Crawford was in the glass business, we felt it appropriate to use \$5,000 of that gift towards our choir room windows project. Another \$28,000 was used to pay the apportionments in full for the balance of 2016, to take pressure off of the budget. The balance of this wonderful bequest was deposited into the Foundation. From humble beginnings a little over ten years ago, I am pleased to share that our current Foundation balance is now \$654,114.

Like many churches, our membership is aging. How is Grace to meet its budget needs with the loss of so many financial supporters? The answer is through the Foundation! Regardless of your age, income, or net worth I encourage you to consider a bequest by naming the Grace Church Foundation in your will. What about that older life insurance policy? You could name Grace the beneficiary on that policy (and, by changing the ownership, could even get an immediate tax deduction).

Gifts of appreciated securities is yet another very favorable tax planning tool. There are many different ways you can help continue Grace's mission, vision, and goals after you are gone. You can do many of these "planned giving ideas" without affecting your current income, and, in some circumstances, actually increase your current income.

It's been several years since we held the last Fools' Day Dinner and Auction. I felt it time to share this update on where we are as a Foundation and, more importantly, raise awareness of giving opportunities.
